Cyclists:

Below is information regarding the route details and bike rental opportunities. I've also included some other links that you might be interested in looking at as they are great places to go for runs and leisurely rides & walks.

ROUTE

We will be using the Unknown Cycling Team's route which can be a 10, 18 or 25 mile loop. I hope to do the 25 miler and tack on 2-3 extra miles so that we can ride down into the US National Whitewater Center. The link below has alot of info regarding that ride. I've done the ride several times and there are some hills but nothing really substantial. Some of the roads are a little worn and have traffic but all in all, a good route. A REMINDER THAT THIS WILL BE AN EASY PACE RIDE, NO DROP POLICY.

We will start the ride at the Westin hotel as close to 2pm as possible. Ride will end at Unknown Brewery which is about a mile from the hotel on Mint Street. Unknown has it's own craft beers, serves pizza and occasionally has food trucks.

If there is a desire to do a longer route that is easy to do still using the existing route listed above. I figure we play this by ear and decide on route what the group wants to do. Miles can be tacked on out by the Whitewater center or we can head back out after dropping folks off at Unknown.

I will carry some spare tubes and CO2 cartridges, but the rentals usually come with w a seat bag. The bike shops offering rentals are listed below. Some will provide helmets, some won't. Please confirm helmet availability when you call. They are happy to install clipless pedals if you bring your own set. Also, if you have them, bring lights for both the front and rear of the bike. I would start at the top of the list and call Bicycle Sport. I've known the owner, Ben, for a long time (He's built up three of my bikes) and he is a great guy. Mention that you're with the POSNA Orthopedic group coming into town and Kevin Casey recommended calling for a rental bike. He will need to know your frame size. He is happy to deliver the bikes to the Westin if a group of folks rent bikes from his shop. The other guys in the shop can certainly help too.


